## New Program: Owl Prowl at McConnell Springs

In November McConnell Springs hosted an exciting program that we haven't offered before, an Owl Prowl that was led by Dr. Tom Sproat with Critters in the Classroom. Owl prowls by themselves are a fairly common program at nature parks like the Springs, indeed countless other parks around the country host similar programs each year. Usually the program consists of a group of participants walking through an area in the evening and using some sort of device to play owl calls in hopes of getting an owl to call back. The program that Dr. Sproat provides does this as well but has an exciting twist of presenting live owls. Dr. Sproat brought three different species of owls to the parks as part of his program, an Eastern Screech Owl named Valentine, a Barred Owl named Luna, and a Great Horned Owl named Kentucky. Participants got the chance to see the birds up close,

learn about their distinct features, and take an owl selfie before going out into the park to listen for wild owls. This program was a great suc-



cess with nearly 70 people attending to see the birds and try to find their wild cousins in the park. The program was sponsored by the Friends of McConnell Springs. The staff at the park hope to bring more exciting programs like this to the public in 2020 so be sure to check our calendar of events for further details.

## Notes from the Naturalist...

McConnell Springs was proud to be a participant in Tree Week 2019 this year, which was a great success not only at the park

but around Lexington as well. Tree week is a collaborative effort by many groups and individuals but is largely planned through the Urban Forest Initiative at UK. Dozens of programs and projects were scheduled during that week in October that allowed hundreds of people the opportunity learn more about trees and their importance in our community. McConnell Springs was host to one project and one program, a tree planting around the Blue Hole and an education program focusing on caterpillars led by Tracy Wells. The tree planting brought in dozens

of volunteers into the park, including a class from the Redwood Cooperative School, who planted 52 trees in an area where invasive plant species have been removed. The species of trees planted were sycamore, sugar maple, black gum, and a bald cyprus. The caterpillar program focused on specific trees that can be planted in gardens that are host plants for different species of caterpillars. The staff at McConnell Springs would like to thank the Urban Forest Initiative, Tracy Wells, Heather Wilson, and several of her colleagues with LFUCG Division of Environmental Services for bringing these programs and events to the park.

# Rita's Ride Helping Students to the Springs

Rita's Ride to the Springs Transportation Grant is a great opportunity for a school to receive reimbursement for the cost of buses when planning a field trip to McConnell Springs. This grant is open to all schools in Kentucky and the grant application is accepted year around. The program is funded by The Friends of McConnell Springs and each application is voted on by the Board of Directors. Since this program has been introduced, thousands of students have had the opportunity to visit McConnell Springs and experience a high quality field trip without the school having to worry about the burden of paying for the transportation. In 2019 two schools were recipients of the grants, Breckinridge Elementary and Lexington Traditional Magnet School. Each of these schools brought an entire grade level to the park for an educational experience. The staff



at the park hopes to continue to attract new schools to the program in 2020 and beyond.
