- An acknowledgement by board chair Charlie Boland of the dedicated service and accomplishments of several guests and board members in attendance;

2019 Author Speaker Series Line Up Set for this Spring!

March 12 - Robert Thompson - author, storyteller,

Bob Thompson, will give us a talk on "Preserving our History and Culture, one Story at a Time."

This presentation will feature stories written and told by the author on his long-running NPR radio show, Kentucky Homefront and in his book, Hitchhiker, Stories from the Kentucky Homefront.

These personal narratives will be used to explain the author's process of mining memories, diaries, and family artifacts to explore, preserve and share our common threads.



April 9 - Eddie Price - author, speaker, actor

Eddie Price will bring his program called "Kentucky After the War of 1812" which is the historical period covered in his historical novel "One Drop--A Slave!" "One Drop--A Slave!" is the long-awaited sequel to his excellent first novel "Widder's Landing".
