Spring has sprung at McConnell Springs Park and the magic of the season is on full display with wildflowers, flowering trees and an abundance

of wildlife. Bird-watching enthusiasts have been visiting the park in greater numbers with the hope of catching a glimpse of some of our migrating feathered friends. Wild Birds Unlimited – Lexington held their annual Bluegrass Birding Festival event with success and helped us to upgrade our bird feeders at the park as well. We also just hosted Parks May the 4th Be With You program, an annual Star Wars themed event, despite the weather the patio and Education Center were bustling

with characters of all ages. To round out big events at the Park this Spring, the celebration of Lexington's founding 250 years ago will be on full display with the Friends annual Founders Day celebration. We are excited for the expanded programming this year throughout the park, which includes historical information prior to the naming of Lexington in 1775. <u>June 10</u> Telling the Whole Story: Black History at Ashland

Speaker: Eric Brooks

This presentation will provide some perspective of the people of color, enslaved and employed, who lived and worked at Ashland from 1808-1948. This is a story of resistance

and resilience. Black people at Ashland had rich and interesting lives and created agency for themselves even though they faced injustice and racism on a constant basis. Black people at Ashland were rarely able to record their stories or preserve evidence of their lives. We have to tease that information from a range of sources, and it often comes in fragments that we must assemble into stories.
