In September of 2023, Mayor Linda Gorton created a 250LEX Commission to help with the acknowledgment and celebration of Lexington's 250th anniversary. A group of civic-minded volunteers then set out to create a yearlong calendar of "Interesting, inclusive and memorable events" for the residents and our visitors to enjoy.

Now, over a year later, 250LEX is coming to life with over 100 events and a month-by-month platform that showcases key elements of the city's makeup - such as Wellness, Equine and the Culinary communities. The 250LEX commission has created several new events as well as enhancing existing events in 2025, many with the hope of becoming legacy events for years to follow the celebratory year.

Notes from the Naturalist...

As we head into the winter months, I am pleased to share that we have introduced a self-guided experience

to the park which is a geology podcast that the Friends of McConnell Springs helped bring to my attention. When visitors come to the park there are rack cards with QR codes to scan and listen to the podcast as you walk the trail, it is a neat immersive experience to add to your visit. The McConnell Springs staff planted 25 trees in the Roots for Remembrance Plot #1 this Fall, thanks to generous donations through the program, and to the volunteer efforts of Dr. Peter Fosl's Environmental Philosophy class at Transylvania University.

The Transy students have been spending part of their class time removing Winter Creeper (*Euonymous fortunei*) from Plot #1 of the Roots for Remembrance program, and have started to work on Plot #2. The team and I have some winter projects planned, which includes continued invasive species removal efforts, specific scheduled volunteer days to help with park feature enhancements and more. Please stop in the Education Center during your visit with any questions and the team will be glad to share any updates with you at that time. Thank you for your support of this wonderful park and part of our community, it is a gift to be an ambassador for this special place.

McConnell Springs is a natural and historic site at 416 Rebmann Lane in Lexington, Ky. The park has two miles of trails that lets you explore the sinking springs, vegetation, stone fences and vestiges of historic buildings. McConnell Springs boasts more than 130 species of plants and numerous species of urban wildlife that reside at or visit the park. The unique geologic, natural and historic features are protected, providing environmental, cultural and historical education opportunities for the residents of Fayette County and elsewhere.
